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The Rules:

1. Every student has to give an individual presentation of the work he did in the lab course. If group members have worked intensively together (as it was required), they may decide upon the partitioning of the presentation but still, all group members have to give a presentation.
2. For the presentation, each student has 10 minutes and may prepare up to two overhead slides. These have to be printed out before the talk. It is recommended that these two slides contain the complete project as an UML graph with the classes implemented by the group highlighted and another UML graph just containing the relevant classes with all methods and fields and their relationship.
3. The presentation should cover the requirements fulfilled by the class, design issues, the tests implemented (and why they are good tests), the implementation of the methods and the function of the class in the whole system.
4. After the presentation, the student will be defending his work in front of the class. The Lab Instructor and the TAs will mainly ask the questions. The questions asked will not only be about the group's work but also about the project and its design as well as software engineering and C++ in general. This will take approximately 10 minutes.
